### 1. Call to Order/Roll Call/Introductions:

The meeting convened at 6:01 PM. Chair Bruder Confirmed attendance.

- 3. Review and Approval of October 10th, 2023, Meeting Minutes:

#### 5. Oral Communications:

Our Health Officer, Dr. Hernandez joined the meeting and shared information about recent development, Harm Reduction Coalition(volunteer syringe exchange program). HRC working with state to get re-Authorization, the court has directed HRC to seize operations. They are working with attorney and also courts to appeal to decision and

have submitted paperwork to state for re-Authorization. The county is looking into how to support participants who were receiving services through HRC, referring patients to exchange site.

### 6. New Business/Action Items:

- 6.1 Guest speaker Alejandro Monroy, mental health client specialist for MAT, providing services to people experiencing and addiction. Case managers carry a case load of 40 to 50 participants at 3 county clinics, HPHP, Emeline Clinic and Watsonville Health Center. Work with behavioral health, to provide therapy an or psychiatry services to participants if needed. Usually patients come into the clinic and inform the provider of an issue, for example, using too much heroin. Provider does a warm hand off and offers services to patient, case manager assesses situation. After intake appt., 3 expectations. An individual counseling session with drug and alcohol case manager, attend support group on weekly basis and take medication as prescribed by provider. Clients are met where they are at, after assessment, participants are placed in a tier system according to the services needed. Providers provide the following medication: for alcohol use disorder vivitrol, once a month via injection. Also Nalxetrone in pill form, taken daily. For opioid use disorder -sobuxone strips and injections. For methamphetamine use disorder, vivitrol is also prescribed. Connection to SSP, patients come into clinic for services and they are referred to SSP for other services or resources.
- 6.2 <u>Update on acquiring SSP QR Code through county account, with ability to retrieve data, how many people are scanning the code, where is it being scanned?</u>: Rahshan has access to county QR code, data to be shared at next meeting. Rahshan reached out to SC metro to ask about the syringe disposal in their restrooms, can we add QR code. Waiting on response
- 6.3 Follow up on QR code with data: Data to be presented at next meeting.
- 6.4 <u>Follow up on invitation to CDPH rep. guest speaker:</u> Commissioner Sturm invited Alessandra Ross, Director of office of aids CDPH, she oversees all SSP in the state to next meeting. Alessandra will attend 1/9/2023 meeting and will present power point, talk about trends in the state, 15 minute presentation.
- 7. <u>Program Updates:</u> Rahshan presented on distribution and collection of syringes and enhanced referrals and education.
- 10 of 341 participants at mobile exchange sites accessed non drug use supplies e.g., Fentanyl test strips, Narcan, smoking kits or syringes.
- Supply kit production, currently volunteers help put together supply kits, looking to increase shifts due to high demand.

Mobile Exchange Syringe Distribution and collection.

-Syringes collected at mobile exchange sites through end of October: 768

- Syringes dispensed at Mobile Exchange sites through end of October: 118
- Persons who inject drugs often don't have the syringes at point of exchange.
- We are continuing distribution of sharps containers and maintaining readiness for and increase in syringe exchange at mobile sites.

### **Mobile Exchange Smoking kit Distribution**

- 341 exclusive mobile exchange participants(have not accessed out fixed sites)
- 315 of those participants accessed pipes and not syringes (92%)
- We are limiting distribution of smoking kits to one of each variety at mobile exchange.

#### Smoking vs. Injection as Harm Reduction. Info found on Smoking Kit Brochures

- Injecting less is frequently is associated with lower risk of bloodborne pathogen transmission.
- Risk of overdose is far less likely when smoking vs. injecting
- Injecting less frequently is associated with fewer skin and soft tissue infections.
- Some of the harms of injection drug use, like endocarditis, are injection-specific
- Reduces community syringe litter

#### **Enhanced Referrals and Education**

- We are continuing our close collaboration with MAT team and Street Medicine to Facilitate
- We are continuing to work to hire our SSU SUD navigators for and have top candidates.

#### Preparing Mobile Exchange Site for winter(rain).

- SSP has awning to use in Watsonville site
- Rashan to follow up with City of Santa Cruz about another possible site in Santa Cruz The commission discussed reaching out to HRC to see how SSP can help while they are not able to provide services. Possibly give HRC QR code for SSP.

Commissioner offered her assistance putting together hygiene kits.

# **SSP Advisory Commission Sunsetting**

February 13, 2024

## **Background**

- On October 17, 2023, the Board directed the County Administrative Officer (CAO) to develop recommendations for commission restructuring, related to the "A Santa Cruz County Like Me" (ASCCLM) project to address underrepresentation in local government
- On January 30, 2024 recommendations on County commission restructuring were proposed to the Board of Supervisors.
- County Administrative Office recommended that the Board sunset several commissions, including the Syringe Services Program Advisory Commission.
- On February 13, 2024, the ordinance repealing County Code Chapters to sunset various advisory commissions will be on the Board agenda.
- Commissions will sunset on March 31, 2024 to allow time to complete any existing work and provide for any transitions.

## Distribution and Collection

Hybrid Model Pilot update

Data from August-November 2023 shows that fixed site locations are preferred access points for participants using our one-for-one syringe exchange policy

Mobile sites have had tremendous success reaching participants and distributing harm reduction supplies

 Oct. vs. Nov. 2023 Syringe Collection and Distribution increase at all exchange sites

Oct. 2023---- Collected **7978** Dispensed **6308** Nov. 2023--- Collected **13492** Dispensed **11384** 

## Safe Disposal

• Hybrid Model Pilot update

Downtown Streets Team (DST) data shows continuing decrease of syringe litter along designated routes

• July-Nov. 2022 vs July-Nov. 2023 DST

2022 = 2216 Syringes

2023 = 1103 Syringes

# Syringe Services Program (SSP) Hybrid Model Pilot Update December 2023

On April 25th, 2023 the HSA SSP program presented its <u>Biennial Report</u> to the county BOS which included a recommendation to adopt recommendations from the SSP Advisory Commission to pilot a hybrid model that reduces exchange service at the Emeline and Watsonville fixed-site locations. This report has been created to provide an update for the first three months of implementation of the Pilot SSP Hybrid model in both Santa Cruz and Watsonville from August 2023 to November 2023.

## Exchange Models: Watsonville vs. Santa Cruz

SSP staff co-located with HPHP Street Medicine Staff at both locations

## Watsonville Mobile Exchange

- Staff conducted supply distribution and syringe collection with a dedicated table.
- Conducted at an established outreach location with regular presence of representatives from other service providers such as Salvation Army, Salud Para La Gente, and Community Action Board.





## Santa Cruz Mobile Exchange

- Staff utilized a wagon and backpack for supply distribution and syringe collection.
- Conducted in multiple locations with a split 2-hour shift: Coral St./Limekiln St. and River Walk between Water St. and Soquel Ave. bridges on the west/downtown side of the San Lorenzo River.
- Emails sent to City of Santa Cruz Staff: Tuesday for planned Mobile site locations before each shift and Thursday for activity updates after each shift.

## Participant Snapshot: August 1st - November 30th 2023

Six Hundred and Sixty Six total unique individuals encountered

- At Mobile Exchanges = 452 (67.9%)
- At Fixed Site Exchanges = 182 (27.3%)
- Both Fixed and Mobile Exchanges = 32 (4.8%)

#### **450 First Time Participants**

- 382 (85%) initially reached at mobile sites.
- Out of the 382, 98% exclusively use mobile sites for exchange.
- 67 (15%) initially reached at Fixed sites.
- Out of the 67, 91% exclusively use fixed sites for exchange.

#### Santa Cruz Focus

132 individuals exclusively used the Emeline Fixed site exchange between August 2021 and August 2023 and visited an SSP location from Aug to Nov 2023.

- Since Mobile Exchange started.
  - 17 out of 132 participants exclusively used our mobile exchanges.
  - 11 out of 132 accessed both mobile and fixed sites.
  - **104 out of 132** exclusively used our fixed site for program access.

## **Supply Distribution**

August 2023-November 2023

### **Total Program Syringe Distribution and Collection**

- 36048 Syringes Collected
- 29610 Syringes Distributed

### Syringes Distributed and Collected at Mobile Sites:

- 1308 Syringes Collected
- · 250 Syringes Distributed

#### **Smoking Kits Distributed**

- 1913 smoking kits distributed all various exchange sites
- 847 smoking kits distributed from Mobile sites
- 495 smoking kits distributed at Santa Cruz Mobi**l**e exchange shifts.

Fixed site policy allows a maximum of 3 smoking kits per participant.

Mobile site policy allows a maximum of 2 smoking kits per participant.

## Syringe Litter

July 2023-November 2023

- Downtown Streets Team reports a continual decline in total syringe litter collection numbers for the City of Santa Cruz Routes.
- The County Department of Public Works has not reported any syringe litter collection for the Watsonville Area since January 2023..
- The latest kiosk near Kaiser Arena on the River Walk path collected 121 pounds of syringe litter from August to November 2023.
- Downtown Streets Team collects syringe litter along 6 routes. Syringe litter collection #s from July-November 2022 compared to the same period in 2023:

Midtown	141	122



## **Pilot Successes**

- Meeting People where they're at performing mobile exchange with street medicine staff has allowed us to find persons who were lost to care for HIV and other infectious disease treatment
- Success referring participants for treatment
- Co-locating with MAT providers and Medical Assistants during mobile exchange facilitates immediate links for participants to schedule treatment appointments at County Health Centers and Janus.

## **Pending Program Improvements**

- Developing a confidential SSP referral database to track and improve referral success and staff followup efforts for participant access to treatment.
- · Two new SSP SUD navigation staff, funded by a Sierra Health Center grant, will start in the new year.
- Continuing proactive communication and outreach with Watsonville and Santa Cruz, seeking feedback and sharing community complaints or concerns and advising on target areas for mobile exchange.
